CLIMATE CHANGE WORKSHOP

Presenter: Greg McNamara: an experienced geologist and science teacher and also the Teacher Earth Science Education Programme Executive Officer, editor of the Australian Geoscience Council's GeoEdLink e-newsletter, and Education and Outreach Consultant to the Geological Society of Australia. In addition Greg is the Program Director for the Australian Earth and Environmental Science Olympiad for senior school students.

This workshop examines Climate Change. The first component looks at the geological evidence for climate change throughout geological time, discusses the types of climate proxies available and the relative reliability and resolution of these data sets. The second component looks at modern climate change, discusses what greenhouse gases there are and how they work, while also examining data sets [both direct data and proxy data] from around the world and how they influence the thinking of climate scientists. The third component explores the free data sets available and how they can be used to allow students and the public to analyse climate data for themselves.

**A BOITE SCHOOL CHORUS to be held
in Bairnsdale on Sunday August 3 at
Presentation Hall Nagle College**

A wonderful opportunity for students in years 3 - 12 to get together with other students from across East Gippsland to sing in a massed choir, and perform to a large audience.

Since 2004 the Boite Schools Chorus project has involved over 6000 Victorian school students from state, private, rural and urban schools, introducing them to a diversity of cultural practice, teaching them songs and music from migrant and refugee cultures in Victoria.

Each year the Boite schools chorus has a unique theme and story to tell. In 2014 the theme is "Boats – New Treasures in an Old Land". Through music we'll explore songs and stories from 250 years of immigration to this ancient continent and from communities that have been here for thousands of years. This year's concert is directed by James Rigby & Jane Thompson and will feature songs by Archie Roach, Ruby Hunter and Shane Howard. Singing with us at Bairnsdale will be local legend Margaret Roadknight.

These concerts are performed in Melbourne, Ballarat and Wangaratta, now it's Bairnsdale's turn.

Rehearsals are beginning now in schools and after school in some areas.
