Dear Families,

Many Hands (Shovels)

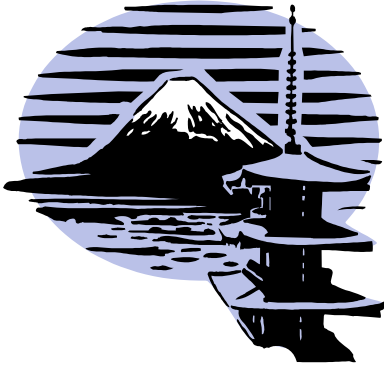
The saying of "many hands make
