Good luck Melody at the Regional Cross Country this Thursday! .



Your help is needed

Please be aware that head lice can easily become a problem at school. You can help stop these pests from spreading by checking your children's hair regularly and commencing treatment should you find any lice or eggs.

How do I treat them?

1. Comb any type of hair conditioner on to dry, brushed hair. This stuns the lice and makes it difficult for them to grip the hair or crawl around.
2. Now comb small sections of the hair with a fine tooth, head lice comb available from a chemist shop
3. Wipe the conditioner from the comb onto a paper towel or tissue
4. Look at the tissue and comb for the presence of lice or eggs
5. Repeat the combing of every part of the head at least 4 or 5 times.

Please remember that chemical head lice treatments should not be used as a precaution or just in case. Repeated use of chemical treatments can lead to the lice developing resistance to the chemical treatments. More information is available at www.betterhealth.vic.gov.au
